





PARISH REGISTRATION:

To be eigible for RE classes, tamilies must first be registered with St. Patrick pareth. SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION

FIRST COMMUNION AND CONFIRMATION:

The Diocese of Savarmah requires two consecutive years of formal cutholic formation classes for the reception of First Communion and Confirmation respectively. Students beginning these classes should note and propere to meet all the requirements necessary including homework assignments. projects, refreats, community service hours and attendance. Students may unly miss 10% of total class time which works out to roughly 3 classes a year. During the two years of preparation, parents/guardians of students will be required to attend designated parent meetings/sessions. They will also be invited to attend various other programs/meetings, which are designed to nourish and strongthon faith and spirifusity. These programs are extremely important, and every effort should be made to attend

First Communion:

Preparation is 1st and 2nd grade with the sacraments bestowed at the end of 2nd grade. They must be of the age of reason (at least 7 years of age) to receive the Sacraments of Reconcliption and Eucharist.

Condidates must complete the minimum of ten hours of parent supervised. family community service by Easter.

After for First Communion Mass for boys shall be dress parts, shirt and tie. Subhports jockets are optional: Girls' dresses should be white and modest (with proper undergaments). Length should cover the knees or longer. No vols or gloves are necessary. When planning for this special day, you know your child best. Please do not purchase anything that will distract their attention from Mass.

St. Patrick RE also offers programs for students who have not received the sacraments at the traditional age, Please contact the RE office directly to develop a plan.

Confirmation:

Preparation is 6th - 8th grade with Confirmation at the end of 8th grade. Candidates are required to participate in service projects. Parents are encouraged to accompany their son' daughter on projects. Details are included in the Confirmation packet distributed at the Confirmation. Meeting for the parent and candidate.

All Confirmation candidates are required to complete all syllabur requirements, participate in designated spiritual refrects and rights of reflection. Notification will be given regarding dates and limes.

SAFETY/SECURITY:

The Parish goal is to provide a safe environment for everyone. For the safety of all, students must be signed in/ out by parent/guardian. It is the parents' responsibility to ensure their child is dropped off and picked up safety! Make sure the catechist is present before leaving your child. Please do not drop children off early without prior approval as we are not staffed to supervise their safety outside of scheduled program hours.

- LATE ARRIVAL: Students arriving more than 15 minutes late may be counted as absent and be required to
 accomplish make-up work. This is especially important for Sacramental Classes! We understand
 special circumstances will arise on occasion please make.accangements through the RE office in advance or as soon as possible.
- EARLY RELEASE: Please early release is to be an exception not every week occurrence (to meet
 diocesan curriculum requirements and prevent classroom disruption). An authorized adult must sign
 the student out with their child's catechist; that person may be asked to show a valid photo ID.
- DISMISSAL POLICY: Students must be picked up from the catechist. They will only be released to a parent/ guardian or authorized person as designated on the Registration Form. If a parent wants to give permission to older siblings or another adult (not listed as an emergency contact) to pick up their child, it must be submitted in writing to the RE office in advance (Texting works as long as you are a current contact in DRE's cell phone). Students will not be released without a properly authorized guardian.
- LATE PICKUP: All students remaining after dismissal time will be brought to the RE office. A Parentiguardian/ emergency contact will be called. An authorized adult must come to the office to pick their child up.

CONFIDENTIALITY: Catechists/RE volunteers will keep information entrusted to them confidential providing no one's life, health or safety is at risk.

ANTI-BULLYING POLICY:

DEFINITION:

Sultying is any versus, written, conduct or gesture directed at a person by anyone that has the effect of:

- Causing a person to lear damage to or ross or personal property.
- Creating an intimisating or hostle environment.

Bullying may involve but is not limited to teasing, name-caling, sturs, namons, potas, face accusations, infinitiation, staking, inhusinos, demaning comments, prantis, social isolation, gestures, cyber-bullying or other verbe, physical or written conduct. Cyber-bullying includes the misuse of digital technology by means of any technological tool such as; sending or posting inappropriate email missages, instant messages, digital images or exhibite postings (including blogs and social network sites). This definition includes subents and/or adults who either directly engage in an act of bullying or who, by their senses, support snormer personns act of bullying. REPORTING COMPLANTS:

Each student and parent have a moral duty to report any bullying to the RE office immediates; if a student experiences for a parent name of any incident of bullying, the incident must be promptly reported to the DRE. The DRE displays the student-parent with a Sultying Compater Report Form which must be completed by the compassining party so that the DRE may arisine further inquiry. DISCIPLINARY ACTION:

Any person found to have violated this policy will be subject to appropriate disciplinary action, which may include temporary removal from the classracen, loss of phologos, community service, counseling, parent contenence, suspension, expussion, and/or notification to appropriate authorities. DISPLAY OF AFFECTION:
